Lissajous Mirrors - demonstration and limited participation (Primary age upwards)

- Acoustic using string/mirrors apparatus
- Electric using mirrors attached to two vibration generators and signal generators
- Photographs

Harmonograph - Pendulum drawing (Primary age upwards)

- Various kinds of harmonograph with weighted string or metal tube pendulums
- Harmony drawing ink on (prepared) paper/acetate. Light trails (photographed)

Pendulum Painting (Primary age upwards)

- String pendulum with weighted paint pot
- Harmony painting paint or sand on paper

Pendulum engraving (Primary age upwards)

- String pendulum with weighted plumb bob
- Harmony engraving in sand
- Taking a cast of engraving
